# OFFICIAL CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS REGULAR SESSION MARCH 19, 2018

A regular session of the Granite Falls City Council was called to order by Mayor David Smiglewski at 7:00 p.m., Monday, March 19<sup>th</sup>, in the Council Chambers of City Hall. Council Members present: DuWayne Galow, Sarina Otaibi, Steve Nordaune, Joe Fagnano and Scott Peterson. Staff present: City Manager Crystal Johnson and Finance Director Neal Carstensen. Also in attendance were EDA Director Cathy Anderson, Police Chief Brian Struffert, Duane Mead, KCC Director Nick Richter, Mike Amborn, Mary Grey and Advocate Tribune News Reporter Alex Sina.

- MINUTES: M/S NORDAUNE/GALOW TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE MARCH 5<sup>th</sup> REGULAR MEETING. Motion carried unanimously.
- BILLS: M/S NORDAUNE/PETERSON TO APPROVE BILLS PRESENTED FOR PAYMENT. Motion carried unanimously.
- POLICE REPORT: Police Chief Struffert was in attendance to present an award to Duane Mead for his help in assisting Police Chief Struffert in controlling and securing an out-of-control juvenile prisoner.
- BERT RANEY PARKING: Mary Grey was in attendance to request a "No Parking During School Hours" sign be placed to the north side of 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue between 4<sup>th</sup> Street and Kilowatt Drive. Following discussion M/S NORDAUNE/OTAIBI TO PLACE "NO PARKING DURING SCHOOL HOURS" SIGN ALONG THE NORTH SIDE OF 7<sup>TH</sup> AVENUE BETWEEN 4<sup>TH</sup> STREET AND KILOWATT DRIVE AND THE SCHOOL WILL MAKE KILOWATT DRIVE JUST NORTH OF 7<sup>TH</sup> AVENUE A DROP-OFF ZONE. Motion carried unanimously.
- BARBER CIRCLE/DANIELS DRIVE: City Engineer Mike Amborn was in attendance to review the proposed construction of Barber Circle and Daniels Drive. Following discussion, Galow introduced a resolution accepting the engineering report and calling for a public hearing on the proposed improvement to be set for Monday, April 2<sup>nd</sup> at 7:15 p.m.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 18-38**

RESOLUTION ACCEPTING REPORT AND CALLING FOR HEARING ON PROPOSED BARBER CIRCLE & DANIELS DRIVE IMPROVEMENTS

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 18-37 a report has been prepared by the city engineer with reference to the proposed construction of Barber Circle and Daniels Drive to include development of Barber Circle & Daniels Drive areas located in the Highland Park 4<sup>th</sup> Addition. The improvement

would require street construction, sanitary sewer, watermain and storm sewer.

WHEREAS, the report provides information regarding whether the proposed improvement is necessary, cost-effective, and feasible; whether it should best be made as proposed or in connection with some other improvements; the estimated cost of the improvement as recommended; and a description of the methodology used to calculate individual assessments for affected parcels.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF GRANITE FALLS, MINNESOTA,

- 1. The council will consider the improvements in accordance with the report and the assessment of abutting or affected areas for all or a portion of the cost of the improvements pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapter 429 at an estimated total cost of the improvements of \$588,000.
- 2. A public hearing shall be held on such proposed improvements on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of April, 2018 in the Council Chambers of City Hall at 7:15 p.m., and the clerk shall give mailed and published notice of such hearing and improvements as required by law.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 17-3 council accepted a proposal from Missouri River Energy Services to complete an Electric Rate Study; and

WHEREAS, the Electric Rate Study was presented to council at its January 16, 2018 meeting; and

WHEREAS, the Electric Rate Study recommended consideration of a two-stepped increase in the electrical rates with the first adjustment of 2% to become effective with the utility bills due June 15, 2018 with the second adjustment of 2% to become effective with the utility bills due February 15, 2019; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 18-25 council did advertise in the Granite Falls Advocate Tribune on March 7, 2018, for a public hearing to be held Monday, March 19, 2018, at 7:30 p.m. to obtain input from citizens regarding the above-referenced adjustment to the electrical rates.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF GRANITE FALLS, MINNESOTA, adopting the proposed electrical rate of 2% effective with the utility bills due June 15, 2018 and 2% effective with the utility bills due February 15, 2018.
